John Shepherd joined the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club (NTCC) after a successful career as a competitive dinghy sailor. John proved himself to be a stalwart of the Club and saw himself as the protector of the Clubs' interests. He was a fixture on the NTCC committee, rising to the position of Vice President.

John's photographic passion was landscape, especially rural and boating scenes. With these strengths, he was extremely competitive in NTCC competitions, as well as in Tasmanian Photographic Federation competitions.


John was a living example of life-long learning. He mastered Photoshop in his 70s. He made his time available to Club members on to assist them and improve their photographs.

John could not resist the temptations to add more farm animals or boats to his landscape images. A rural scene with cattle, horses or sheep in the image was probably one of John's images, and the animals had likely been added.

John and his wife, Betty, arranged for the Club to conduct monthly meetings at the Glenara Aged Care Facility for several years.

John also made a substantial contribution to preserving historical photos of Northern Tasmania in conjunction with the Northern Regional Library and the Community History section of the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery including documenting the photography of Launceston photographic pioneer, William Cawston.

The John Shepherd Memorial Landscape Trophy is a fitting memorial to a person who made an enormous contribution to the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club.




Shane Westley received an Honourable Mention for his image "Not biting" in the latest round of the competition.
