

The Northern Tasmanian Camera Club has entered the Interclub Competition organised by the Photographic Society of America for the past 5 years, the last two years, competing in the B section of the competition.

In the 2020/21 competition, the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club finished in 6<sup>th</sup> position in the B section, competing against teams from the Americas, Asia and Europe. This is remarkable achievement for a team from regional Australia.

In the third round of the interclub competition, Jim Jacob, for his image "Cadillac of the Sky", and Steve Whitworth for his image "Rock the Core", were awarded Honorable Mentions (See images on page 7).

The Launceston-based club will compete in 2021/22 with the goal of being promoted to the A grade section for 2022/23.

The Club is also considering entering the Interclub competition for nature photography in 2021/22.
