



Retracing "Voyage in a Caravan" to St Helens Great Adventure, Then and Now



On December 8th, 1896, Frank Styant Browne, photographer and Joshua Higgs, artist, embarked on an epic journey in a horse-drawn caravan to St Helens via the Fingal Valley and back to Launceston via Weldborough and Scottsdale.

On 22nd and 23rd May this year, members of the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club set out from Launceston to follow the caravan's route, where possible. The connection between the two trips was that Frank Styant Browne was the driving force leading to the formation of the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club in 1889.
