

A Tribute to Norton Harvey OAM, SSAPS and FAPS 10-3-1928 – 5-6-2021


Those letters after Norton's name tell us a lot about Norton, his life, his interests, and his commitment to the organisations he belonged to and supported.

He received The Order of Australia (OAM) on Monday 10 June 1996 for service to the arts as a photographer and to photographic organisations, particularly the Launceston Photographic Society, the Tasmanian Photographic Federation, and the Australian Photographic Society. In 1997 the Australian Photographic Society also honoured him with the distinction State Service Australian Photographic Society (SSAPS) for services to photography in Tasmania. He achieved the APS distinction of Fellow Australian Photographic Society (FAPS) at a time when this was the highest skills award.



Norton's love of bushwalking, the flora and fauna of Tasmania and its wilderness captured Norton's interest early in his life through his father and it continued through all his many lifelong activities. He started bushwalking in the mid-40s, but it was not until 1959 that he joined the Launceston Walking Club. Through this club he soon became involved with the production of the club's 'Do You Know Tasmania' show. Over the next 30 years 50 films were produced. Norton did all or part of the filming on 45 of them, was co-editor on all of them, and did all the splicing. In more recent years he worked on a project to get those films onto DVD.

He also wrote several books, Tasmania, Southern Tasmania in Colour, Northern Tasmania in Colour, Wildflowers of Tasmania, and National Parks of Tasmania. His bushwalking skills and photography took him on many journeys into Tasmania's wilderness to take the photographs for his books, to many places most people will never see. He had articles published in Walkabout magazine, the Women's Weekly and other tourist and industrial publications.



Norton was a life member of the Launceston Walking Club. He was also a life member and Past President of the Launceston Field Naturalists Club, a member of the Royal Society and National Trust.

His photographic journey started during the Second World War when cameras and film were not readily available. In 1944 he was able to purchase his first camera a Baby Brownie, he very quickly decided he wanted something better and a few days later purchased a folding Kodak. It was this camera that accompanied him on many of his early bushwalking trips. Of course, over the years he had many cameras including cameras suitable for 3D work. He had a large collection of original cameras including stereo cameras and equipment.

He joined his first Camera Club, Launceston Photographic Society (LPS), in 1950 and very quickly took on the role of Secretary, he later took on other roles, including President. His contribution was recognised, and he was made a life member.

In the early 90s he and his wife Jean moved to Gravelly Beach. He joined West Tamar Camera Club (WTCC) in 1991. Norton was a long-time member of the West Tamar Camera Club where he held the positions of President, Secretary, Projectionist and Committee Member over a period of many years. He was also a life member of this club.

As well as being an accomplished traditional photographer, Norton was also a skilled and successful 3D photographer.

He joined the Sydney Stereo Camera Club in 1997 and quickly became a competitive 3D Photographer in club competitions. He also participated in international 3D exhibitions and attended 3D Photography conventions. Most of Norton's award-winning 3D images were taken in the Tasmanian wilderness. He was a great ambassador for Tasmania.

Norton was one of the founding members of the Tamar Valley Photographic Exhibition and was its Chairman for many years. When it was decided to expand the Tasmanian exhibitions into the Tasmanian Super Circuit, Norton took on the Chairman's position for that too.

On top of all his many commitments, Norton held the position of President of the Tasmanian Photographic Federation. He was instrumental in setting up the TPF Honours program and has been the coordinator of this work until his passing. Norton was Patron of the TPF. The Norton Harvey Medal for outstanding service to photography was introduced in 2015.

Norton also shared his photography knowledge and skills through courses conducted at Adult Education and TAFE Tasmania.

Norton will be greatly missed by his many photography and 3D photography friends.

Annual General Meeting of the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club: President's Report, Treasurer's Report, Election of Officers, General


- 2. **Fellowship**: members are requested to bring along a plate of finger food. Bar will be open, tea and coffee provided.




