NTCC Founder Frank Styant Browne's Memorabilia Returned to Launceston

The Club was contacted by Malcolm Saltmarsh of Hobart, who advised that he was a relative of Frank Styant Browne, and he had a number of pieces of memorabilia that belonged to Frank Styant Browne, including his original camera and tripod. Malcolm advised that he wished to return the memorabilia to our club.

The committee accepted Malcolm Saltmarsh's offer, but it agreed that the memorabilia would be best preserved by being donated to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery (QVMAG).

QVMAG agreed to the proposal and collected the materials from Hobart. Our club will have access to the materials on request.

Inc: Photojournalism, Street and Travel Photography, Statues

SPORTS/ACTION

Moving action and sports Inc; Motor/Water Sport, Airshows, Rodeo

SCAPES

Inc: Landscapes, Seascapes, Cityscapes, Aerial Photography

CONTEMPORARY/CREATIVE

Inc: Composites, Patterns and Created Artwork.

MACRO

Ultra-close-up images that show an object larger than real life.

UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHY

Images that were taken underwater or contain underwater scenes

ARCHITECTURE

Building / Bridge study.

ENGINEERING/MACHINES

Inc: Stationary Vehicles, Machinery, Tools.

LONG EXPOSURE (shows movement)

Inc; milky waterfalls and water

NATURE

Natural images that do not include people, or anything man-made. Often termed 'the hand of man'.

NIGHT PHOTOGRAPHY

Inc: Night-sky, Traffic Trails, Street Lights.

PETS/DOMESTIC ANIMALS/NON-NATURE

Family Pets, Farm Animals, all Non-Nature Creature images

PORTRAIT/PEOPLE

Inc: Weddings, groups, model shots

STILL LIFE (non-macro)

Inc: Food and Product Photography.

EVENT PHOTOGRAPHY

Inc: Music or Fashion events

Note: In a given competition, an entry will consist of four images. Each image is to display a different genre (as detailed above).

Entries for the Robert Mackrill, and Dorothy Mackrill Trophies will be judged by a panel from the Photographic Society of America.

Appreciation Award




Ron Camplin

Paul has worked for the Examiner as a photographer for 30 years. During that time, he has transitioned from film cameras to digital photography. With film cameras, a lot of time was spent transferring the photos to editorial for publication.

With the advent of digital photography, transfer of images electronically is no longer time consuming. Digital photography is not a time-saving technology with so much time spent at the desk reviewing images and identifying people in photos. Paul can generate hundreds of digital photos on a job.

Paul explained that his main objective in taking photos for the Examiner was for the photo to create interest to encourage readers read the accompanying article.

Two of Paul's favourite subjects to photograph are older people, and animals at Tasmania Zoo.




