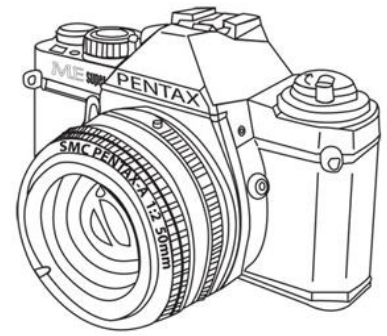

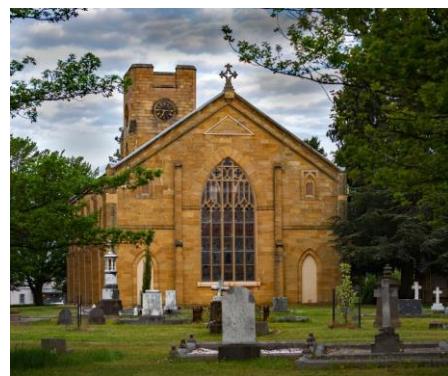

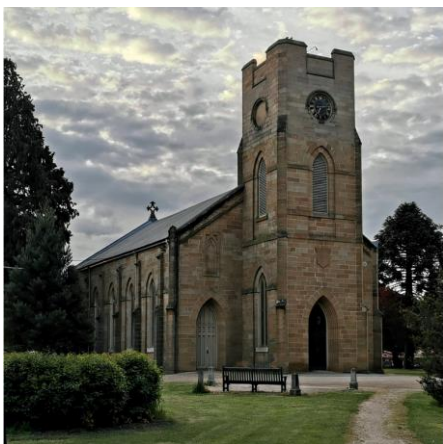

## Longford Night Photoshoot

An excellent turnout of around 20 members met at Longford on the evening of Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October for an evening photoshoot. One of the attractions of Longford is that many of the original buildings haven't been demolished. Despite a pessimistic weather forecast, the rain held off. Cloudy skies generated soft light without pronounced shadows. At the starting time of 7.00pm, light levels were pretty good.

At 7.00pm, members dispersed towards different buildings and street scenes. Christ Church and cemetery in a park-like setting was a popular location. Certainly, members were spoilt for photo-opportunities of heritage buildings. At Longford, the local heritage society has installed brass plaques on heritage buildings explaining the functions of the buildings initially. Mark Brunken discovered that a shop with Bushells signs on the window was the original maternity hospital for Longford.



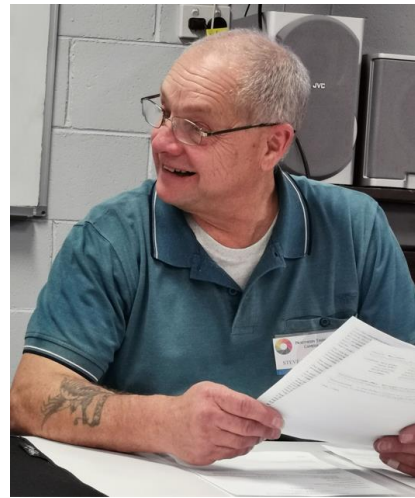

Buildings that attracted the attention of members included Sticky Beak Café, Queen's Arm Hotel and Blenheim Hotel, Longford Town Hall, The Library and JJ's Bakery and Café (formerly The Old Emerald Flour Mill). In Woolmer's Lane, the Big Store was the centre of Longford, housing the supermarket, clothing, hardware, and other goods. After the supermarket relocated, the Big Store is virtually deserted.

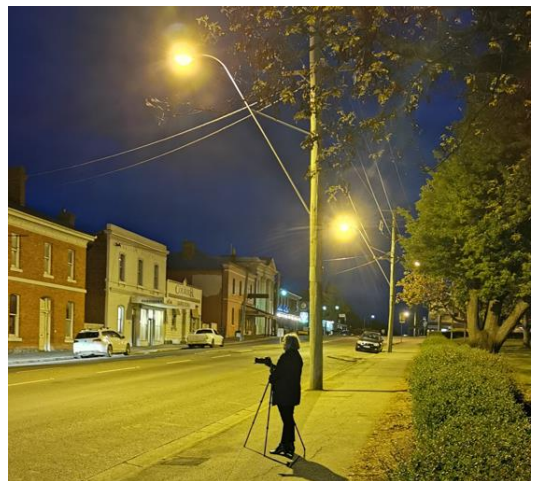

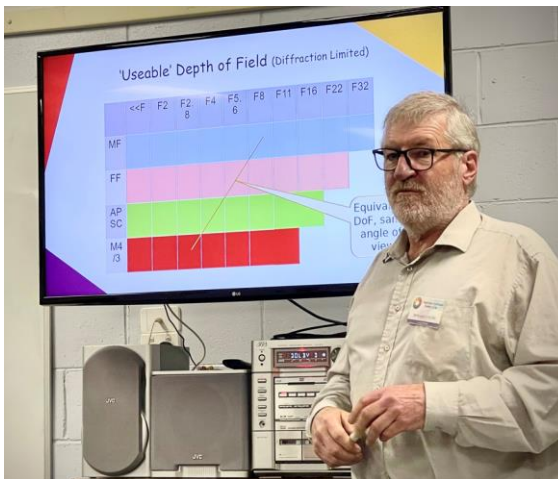
### Learning Session
