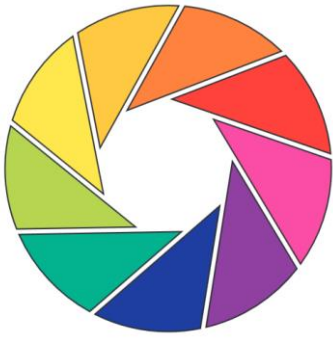
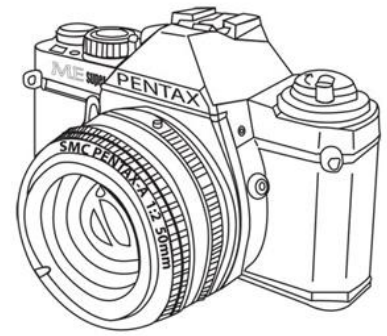

Stunning Tasmanian landscape

Grant is a photographer whose work encompasses landscapes, abstract patterns in nature, wildlife, travel, and adventure subjects. He was born and still lives in Tasmania. He trained as an earth scientist and worked professionally in nature conservation for several years

Grant has been exploring Tasmania's uniquely wild and wonderful landscape for some forty years, with the camera never far from hand. He has also trekked, climbed, skied, and photographed in many other wild and remote areas of the planet.

Grant is particularly attracted to cool climate regions and mountain landscapes, and has explored parts of all seven continents, and many different environments.

Images from Grant's travels have been widely published and continue the Tasmanian tradition of photography activating awareness of the environment.

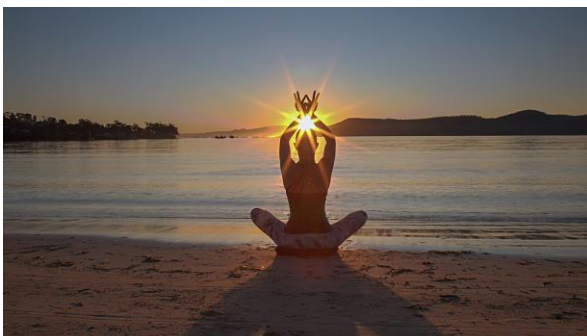
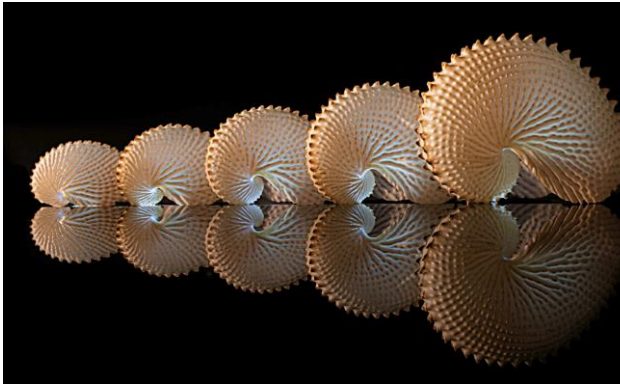

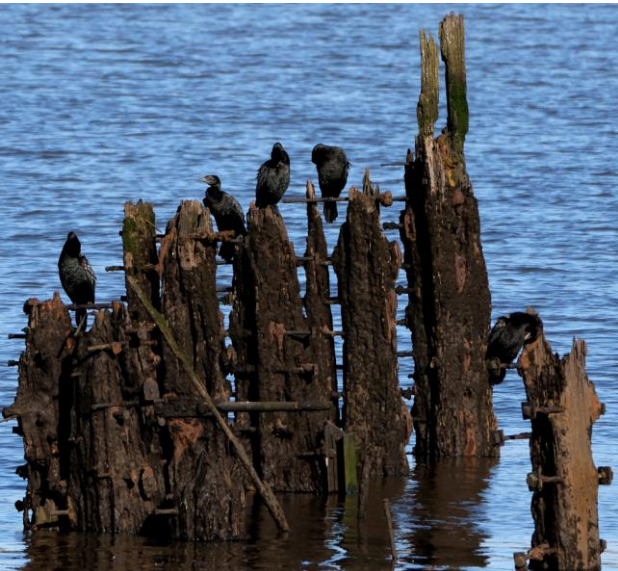


Swans and cygnets

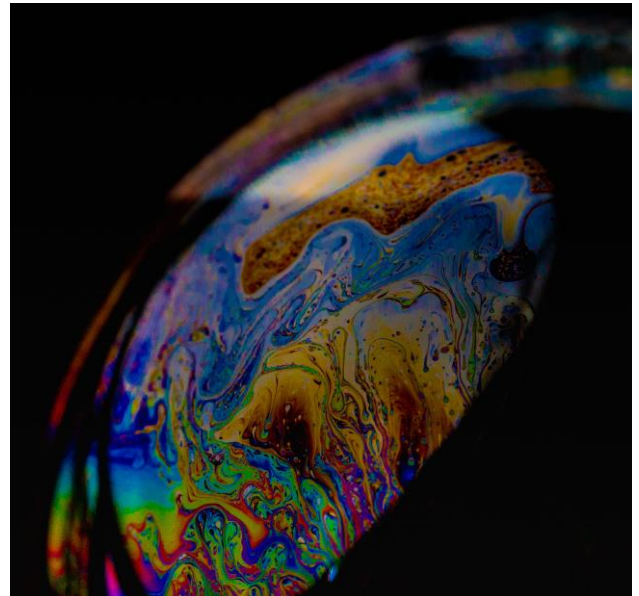
