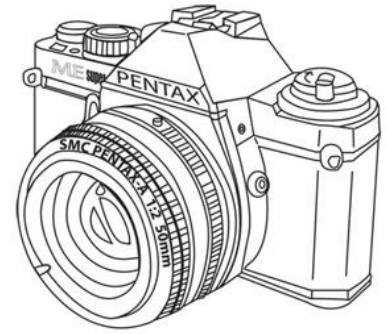

## Highlights of the President's Report for August 2021 to July 2022

President Steve Whitworth presented his fifth consecutive President's report at the Club AGM on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> July 2022. He continues to enjoy being President despite the hard work and occasional frustration.

He singled out Fiona Carter and Ron Camplin for their wonderful service to the club as secretary and treasurer over several years. Both have stepped down from their positions. President Steve also thanked current committee members.

Steve noted that COVID had disrupted club activities. Monthly meetings in February and March were conducted outdoors at Royal Park and Seaport. The club altered meeting formats to alternate between learning sessions and guest speakers. He noted the major contributions of Howard Colvin to the learning sessions. The new giant screen Sony TV installed by the Lions Club at their clubhouse got a big tick of approval from club members.

Competition-wise, it has been a notable year for the club. In the Photographic Society of America's digital image interclub competition, the club finished third in B grade to earn promotion to A grade. The club has again entered the Australia Cup competition, with results due out shortly.

Club competitions continue to be popular with 15 to 17 members entering full complements of images for each quarterly competition. Images have been judged by camera clubs in Hobart, Victoria, Sweden, and the United States. Our club reciprocated by judging competitions for the Ivanhoe Camera Club in Victoria, and the Tasmanian Photographic Federation. President Steve noted that he is very proud of the constant improvement in photography and post-processing.

The monthly club Facebook Challenge has continued to be popular with members. Each month presents a new challenge.

The club has provided over 140 wetlands images for the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery's exhibition of Wetlands, commencing in August.

Club excursions included a late afternoon-evening stroll around Longford, a night shoot at Four Springs Lake and an early evening photoshoot at the Lavender Farm in late December, before the lavender was harvested. Highlight of the club excursions was the three- day photoshoot at Bruny Island where members were spoilt for photo-opportunities such as landscapes, seascapes, sunrises, sunsets, nature photography and heritage buildings. We swapped experiences at the Bruny Hotel over a meal.

Guest speakers at club meetings included Examiner photographers, Paul Scambler and Phillip Biggs, Phil Hallam of Hobart and Grant Dixon, international mountaineering photographer.

Raffles conducted by Muriel Rollins and Sue Griffiths continued to make a valuable contribution to club finances, netting over \$700 for the year.

Two major administrative achievements during the past year were updating the club's competition rules by himself, and the review of the club constitution by Rhonda Mortimer, Ron Camplin, and Rod Oliver. It was pleasing to note the proposed amendments were approved unanimously at the AGM.

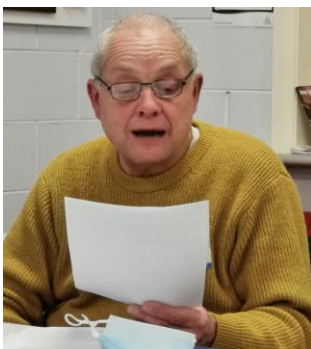

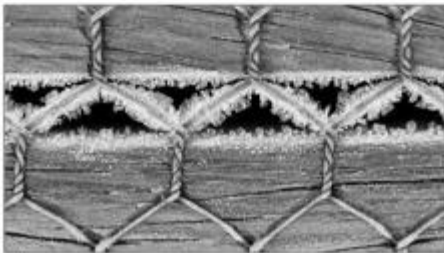
