President Steve was interviewed by Tom Johnson, reporter, and presenter at Channel Seven in the Conservatory in City Park (to get out of the strong wind). Steve talked about the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club, how it had been in existence since 1889, how some of the great Tasmanian photographers were members of the Northern Tasmanian Camera Club.

Steve explained that the Photographic Society of America was the largest organisation for camera clubs in the world. The Northern Tasmanian Camera Club has been and will be competing against the world's best camera clubs. Steve then described the enjoyment he gets from taking and processing photos. Nothing beats being on a deserted beach as the sun emerges over the horizon and bathes the sky with golden colours.

Tom Johnson then interviewed Vice President Rod Oliver who described the benefits of being a member of a camera club, finding out the strengths and weaknesses of his photography. His favourite photo was taken when two outpowered dinghies circumnavigated Australia and he photographed the boats as they approached Hobart. The photo appeared on the front cover of Rotary Down Under, the national Rotary magazine.



- Go past Trowunna Wildlife Sanctuary
- At Mole Creek, stay on B12
- Turn right into Union Bridge Road
- Meeting place is 37 Union Bridge Road

Notes:

- We will carpool from the meeting place. Cars not required can be left at the meeting place.
- Bring food and drink for morning tea and lunch
- Bring wet weather gear
- Due to severe flooding in the area and washouts, a change of route may be necessary. This is being checked out.
- The camera club will provide a simple BBQ at the Mersey White Water Reserve at the end of the excursion. Back at Mole Creek around 3.00pm.
