

Workshop – Understanding the NIK Photo-Editing Suite of Software

On Saturday 21st January, an NTCC-sponsored workshop was held at the Lions club in Kings Meadows.

The purpose of the workshop was to increase members' understanding of the popular photo-editing software referred to as the NIK suite. This NIK software package has been around for many years in several different guises. Originally produced by NIK themselves, it then fell under the Google umbrella before being picked up by DXO, who are the current makers of the software.

The software suite has been gradually improved over the years to become one of the main go-to editing options for photographers worldwide. It acts as a plugin for Lightroom, Photoshop and other major editing brands, where it is regularly used as part of a photographer's editing workflow.

15 NTCC members attended the workshop, which was very pleasing to see. This translated into a good mix of editing ability present, ranging from advanced to beginner.

There were a few initial hiccups as members grappled with the various ways of installing and integrating the software onto their laptops and their workflow, but as soon as those issues were overcome, the workshop started in earnest.

The NIK suite comprises eight separate editing programs, which were all touched-upon during the workshop. However, it was the main three; Colour Efex Pro, Silver Efex Pro and Viveza, that were given the most attention.

A set of raw images was provided to everyone who attended the workshop so that we could all work on the same photographs together. This process proved to be very successful and I'm sure that everyone came away from the course a more proficient and knowledgeable photo editor...... Including me.


