


Triumph for Kelvin Cover photo on national magazine

Triple Success for Sara Barritt




Sara Barritt holding the John Shepherd Memorial Landscape Trophy for her winning image: "Coronet Peak Ski Field"





- As a highly skilled and respected commercial photographer.




Owen Hughes making his presentation at the August meeting, assisted by Rhonda Mortimer


